## JOB ANNOUNCEMENT Supervising Attorney- Stay Housed LA Project

Join Neighborhood Legal Services of Los Angeles County (NLSLA) and become part of an energetic team of advocates that provides a wide range of legal services aimed at addressing issues that disproportionately impact low income communities. These services include high impact litigation, direct services, public policy advocacy, providing training and technical assistance, community education, and supportive services.

NLSLA is currently seeking a Supervising Attorney to oversee a team of attorneys and paralegals as part of our Stay Housed program aimed at addressing the housing crisis, which has been exacerbated by the Covid-19 pandemic. The team of advocates will be focused on providing legal assistance to tenants in eviction proceedings. The ideal candidate will be a skillful attorney who excels in a fast-paced, dynamic anti-poverty law practice and is capable of leading advocacy in multiple forums. The candidate must have a demonstrated passion and commitment to public interest law and prior experience assisting low-income individuals and client groups. The ideal candidate should possess strong oral/written communication, leadership and advocacy skills coupled with patience and sensitivity to working with people in crisis.

The candidate should also be self-motivated with the ability to multi-task; be able to work collaboratively in a team setting and to foster and maintain relationships with community partners. Bilingual proficiency in Spanish, Armenian, Chinese or another language spoken in poverty communities is strongly preferred.
